

Road Maintenance Policy for 2022


Free Rock: The free rock alternate year policy will continue to be 125-150 tons per mile, spread on the county gravel roads. Larger or smaller amounts may be applied to the roads as determined by the County Commission in consultation with the Road and Bridge supervisor.


Match Rock: The policy of permitting citizens to purchase road rock for specific sections of Schuyler County roads at the County's purchase price will be continued. Citizens who elect to purchase Match Rock will pay 50% of the cost of the rock and 50% of the hauling/spreading services. **The County alone will be responsible for hauling and spreading the rock.** The County will no longer honor the Match Rock program if an outside source is used to haul/spread the rock. It will also be up to the County Commission and Road and Bridge supervisor as to what size of rock is to be used on the roads. Citizens must remit the Match Rock payment to the Schuyler County Clerk after delivery of rock is made.


Ice and Snow covered gravel roads: The County does not treat ice covered roads with salt, brine, etc. The County will blade snow once the County Commission and the Road and Bridge supervisor have deemed it necessary to do so.

Dust Control: Dust control on a county gravel road may be contracted with a private firm at the citizens expense. It is required to coordinate any dust control application with the Road and Bridge Supervisor. Once the dust control has been approved, it will be done so with the understanding that at any time, the county can and will blade or rock the road where the dust control has been applied.

These policies have been approved by the Schuyler County Commission and will become effective January 18, 2022.
